INVITATION TO A HIGHER SEMINAR IN EU LAW

Law, Solidarity and the Limits of Social Europe

Following the publication of the edited volume "Law, Solidarity and the Limits of Social Europe" (Edward Elgar Publishing, 2022), the seminar will focus on discussing current and possible future challenges for Social Europe. The volume offers a scholarly account of the socio-legal mechanisms that drive EU constitutional tensions leading to crisis-like situations in two well-defined and interwoven areas: social and labour rights and mobility within and to the EU. During the seminar, Caroline Johansson, one of the contributors to the volume, and Andrea Iossa, one of the editors, will engage in a conversation about the role of solidarity-based principles and values in re-directing EU law and policy towards a democratic Social Europe.

Andrea Iossa is a Senior Lecturer at the Faculty of Business at Kristianstad University. Previously he was a FORTE postdoc fellow affiliated with the Faculty of Law at Lund University. He is part of the organising and scientific committee of the Moving Labour Collective - an international network of progressive labour lawyers.

Caroline Johansson has a Doctor of Laws and holds a position as associate senior lecturer in private law at the Law Faculty, Uppsala University. She defended her doctoral thesis in 2018, in which she examines the relation between Swedish collectively bargained occupational pensions and the EU's internal market law. After her dissertation, she has continued to focus on issues on the border between occupational and public benefits as well as issues regarding the relationship between the Swedish model and EU law.
